

Traffic Strategy – Start building

Two pillars of measures being proposed to address traffic situation

Main focus is to have real and attractive options to using one's own vehicle.

Strengthening Alternative Transport

Public Transport, based on what users and also residents would want to see to shift their use:

- Buses Frequency must increase
- Revisit the routes Shorter Routes Less transitioning
- Demand / Supply increasing supply (number of buses) which costs money as part of the concession agreement
- How to take buses out of the traffic Cleaning the route of transport

Pertinent Data:

- 9% of residents currently use the service, 240,000 unique users. Numbers have currently exceeded pre-Covid use.
- Better coordination of Traffic Management to ensure that buses are not held up due to permitting by Local Councils, etc.
- New Bus Stations and more efficient interchanges
- High frequency routes in busy areas under 4 mins and other levels of increased frequency (4-10mins), increasing frequency by 25%
- Bus Lanes, Bus Gates, Technology to make routes quicker
- Visibility in app for users
- Reduce total journey length by 25% 35%

Other alternatives

- Network of alternative mobility options (walk, bikes)
- First national cycling policy for the island within this year

Services given in Rush Hour

Wholistic approach to shift timeframes to use most hours of the day/night:

- Government Services can they be given off-peak hours?
- Services offered by the private sector currently being considered
 - Courier Services
 - o Deliveries Cargo / retail / commercial
 - Waste Collection
 - Maintenance
- Preferred method of implementation Micro trials and pilot projects

Proposals received to date:

- Back-office operations The Government should lead by example when it comes to implementing hybrid work patterns and the private sector to be incentivised to encourage employees into a hybrid method of working.
- Make it cost less to do services outside peak hours
- Make it pay for businesses shifting operation off-peak -Decentralise Government services from Valletta/Floriana to use other areas of Malta
- Hubs with underground parking that would link to the buses

- Main public sector (law courts / hospitals, etc) not all appointments starting at 9am
- Waste collection to start after 18.00PM
- Noise pollution considerations for residents and tourist areas
- Better visibility of trips on the bus stops and via app
- Communal Transport system for the Public Service workers where possible
- Traffic official attendance during peak hours in high traffic areas
- Gozo to be used as a test base for certain interventions
